On January 1, 2023, Tiffany Sanderson began her tenure as the sixth President of Lake Area Technical College. During her first semester, her objective was to gain extensive knowledge about the programs offered at Lake Area Tech and connect with the partners who advise and support the college.

SANDERSON NAMED

"It's an honor to be part of the Lake
Area Tech team; I'm excited for the
opportunities ahead of us," says
Sanderson. Campus is expanding to
accommodate our student body; two new
programs will kick off this fall in Surgical
Technology and with ButlerMAX ag diesel;
and we're honing in on the ways we
support and educate students to ensure
more skilled scholars enter South Dakota's
workforce."

Since taking the reins as president, South Dakota's public college system was named the best in the country for return on investment for students. President Sanderson continues, "Graduates of Lake Area Tech realize an incredible value. That positions them to strengthen their families, employers, and communities very early in their careers."

The average Lake Area Tech College graduate in 2022 earned enough in their first job after college to earn back the cost of their college degree in just 14 months. Seventeen percent of 2023 graduates had full-ride scholarships and no debt following college.

Sanderson previously served as the South Dakota Secretary of Education. Her career has focused on education and workforce development in the public, private, and nonprofit sectors. Notably, she led South Dakota's technical college system as Director of Career and Technical Education (CTE) and helped develop important efforts like the Build Dakota Scholarship, the state's reduced tuition dual credit program, and funding for technical colleges and regional CTE facilities.

Sanderson grew up on a ranch and graduated from Lemmon High School in 1998. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Agricultural Education from South Dakota State University and Master's degree in Administration: Human Resource Management from the University of South Dakota. Sanderson and her husband Nathan have a 15-year-old son, Carter.

The award was presented at the second annual Community Health Worker South Dakota (CHWSD) conference held in Sioux Falls. The CHW Ally of the Year award is presented to a tireless supporter of the Community Health Worker field and plays a key role in growing, developing, and sustaining the CHW workforce in South Dakota.

Lake Area Tech Community Health Worker Program Supervisor Kelly Heesch submitted the nomination and said, "Heidi was the first Community Health Worker instructor in the state of South Dakota. In addition to her role as Lake Area Tech's Business Partner Specialist, Heidi meets regularly with healthcare and social service organizations promoting the Community Health Worker role across our state. Heidi is actively involved in educating these and other organizations about the important role of CHWs, as well as the cost savings realized by organizations that employ CHWs."

Heidi sought the guidance of CHWSD to establish a solid foundation for the Community Health Worker program at Lake Area Tech. CHWSD Community Outreach Coordinator Ben Tiensvold remarked, "Heidi is such an asset to the CHW workforce in South Dakota through her years of working. She has worked tirelessly to get the LATC CHW training program to where it is today, and, in doing so, has significantly impacted the workforce for years to come. We are so fortunate to have such a developed CHW training program available in South Dakota."

Lake Area Tech offers an online Community Health Worker certificate program. Heesch went on to say, "Heidi adapted and revised LATC's CHW associate degree program to meet the needs of the SD Disparities Grant, creating the first CHW one-semester online curriculum for students across our state."

LAKE AREA TECHNICAL COLLEGE GRADUATES LARGEST CLASS EVER

Lake Area Technical College held its 56th Annual Graduation Ceremony on Friday, May 12 at the Civic Arena in Watertown, SD. The Class of 2023 marks the largest graduating class in school history with 926 students completing their certificates, diplomas, or degrees in 31 programs of study.

Dana Dykhouse, CEO of First PREMIER Bank and Chair of the South Dakota Board of Technical Education, delivered the commencement address to a full house of nearly 5000 family members, guests, and graduates. His message highlighted admiration of the graduates' accomplishments and words of encouragement for their future.

This year, Lake Area Tech College 2023 graduates represented five countries and U.S. territories, 12 different states, and 185 South Dakota communities.

During the ceremony, Lake Area Technical College retired Presidents Deb Shephard and Mike Cartney were recognized for their prior work at the college and were granted President Emeritus status.

Six retirees were also recognized for their service to the college including: Greg Klein, Aviation Faculty and Department Supervisor; Mike Lee, Diesel Technology Faculty; Laurie Malimanek, Admissions Administrative Assistant; Kelly McDaniel, General Education and Agriculture Faculty; Marlene Seeklander, Director of Financial Aid; and LuAnn Strait, Director of Student Services, Marketing and Public Relations.

LAKE AREA TECHNICAL COLLEGE HITS RECORD ENROLLMENT IN 2022-23

With summer session underway, final enrollment for the 2022-23 academic year at Lake Area Technical College (LATC) is in and a new record has been set. With 618 students taking classes over the summer, Lake Area Tech ends the year with a total of 2,655 students, the largest number enrolled in the college's history.

Since 2007, LATC has experienced noteworthy growth, challenging national trends of decreasing enrollments in higher education. The progress is a continued result of focus on the college's mission of changing lives, launching careers, and delivering a strong return on investment for students and employers.

"Our college's approach is designed to help both our students and industry partners win," comments LATC President Tiffany Sanderson. "Students don't come to Lake Area Tech just to graduate. They seek out our programs to both graduate and to launch into great careers."

With continued student body growth, Lake Area Tech's current campus expansion will address needs for additional labs and classrooms. The Diesel Technology addition is scheduled to open this fall. The Dana J. Dykhouse Business Center of Learning and the Advanced Manufacturing Center will open in the fall of 2024.

GRANTED \$3.5 MILLION NIST AWARD

The U.S. Department of Commerce's National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) granted a \$3,561,000 cooperative agreement award to Lake Area Technical College (LATC) to operate South Dakota's Manufacturing Extension Partnership (MEP) Center. The MEP Center, known as South Dakota Manufacturing and Technology Solutions (MTS), provides manufacturers with resources and services dedicated to helping them prosper and grow by reducing costs, increasing revenue, developing their workforce, and optimizing for automation. LATC assumed oversight of MTS on January 1, 2023.

LATC and MTS have a long-standing relationship focused on serving South Dakota manufacturers' needs for skilled employees, particularly the synergism the organizations have in helping industry with new technologies like collaborative robots for automation and 3D metal printing.

A majority of South Dakota's manufacturers have less than 100 employees and 52% have less than 10 employees. According to the South Dakota Department of Labor & Regulation, the state's manufacturing industry is expected to grow by 8% by 2030. Many of LATC's programs, including Business, Computer Information Systems, Custom Paint & Fabrication, Electronic Systems Technology, Energy, Precision Machining, Robotics, and Welding Technology complement nearly every aspect of manufacturing. More than 43,000 South Dakotans are employed in manufacturing businesses across the state.

MTS began in September 2010 with key support from the South Dakota Governor's Office of Economic Development. The state's first cooperative agreement from NIST was awarded in 2013. MTS has offices in Sioux Falls, Aberdeen, Rapid City, and Watertown, and provides group training events, one-on-one business consulting, and an annual manufacturing summit.





LAKE AREA TECH EARNS 2023-24 MILITARY FRIENDLY® SCHOOL DESIGNATION

Lake Area Technical College recently earned the 2023-2024 Military Friendly® School Gold-Level designation. Institutions earning the Military Friendly® School designation were evaluated using both public data sources and responses from a proprietary survey. More than 1,800 schools participated in the 2023-2024 survey with 665 earning special awards for going above the standard.

Methodology, criteria, and weightings were determined by Viqtory with input from the Military Friendly® Advisory Council of independent leaders in the higher education and military recruitment community. Final ratings were determined by combining the institution's survey scores with the assessment of the institution's ability to meet thresholds for Student Retention, Graduation, Job Placement, Loan Repayment, Persistence (Degree Advancement or Transfer), and Loan Default rates for all students and, specifically, for student veterans.

"We are committed to providing our student veterans a seamless transition from military to civilian life to life as a successful student," Lake Area Tech President Tiffany Sanderson said. "Earning the Gold-Level Military Friendly® School award is a reflection of the efforts our entire services staff put forth every day and is a noble honor for our college."

This is the 13th year Lake Area Tech has received the Military Friendly® School award and the seventh time it has received added-level status.

BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF SIGHT WAIVER AWARDED TO THE LAKE AREA TECHNICAL COLLEGE UNMANNED AERIAL SYSTEMS PILOT PROGRAM

Lake Area Technical College (LATC) has been awarded the Federal Aviation Administration Beyond Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) Waiver allowing their Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) Pilot program and embedded program drone technology to advance to the next level of drone operation. The college is the only post-high education system in South Dakota to have acquired the waiver which will enable the students and faculty to conduct complex drone operations and facilitate drones to fly without human interference.

LATC President Tiffany Sanderson commented, "It's an honor for Lake Area Tech to receive the FAA's approval for Beyond Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) drone flight. Our students in programs across campus are now able to learn to fly commercial, fixed-wing drones for applications in many industries."

LATC sought the BVLOS waiver with a goal of producing drone program graduates that have the unique experience of flying long-range missions atypical of small drones. The education is based mainly in a manned commercial pilot core curriculum and drone course electives. This waiver introduces an opportunity for students to perform both manned aircraft operations over a drone range and perform drone operations over the same range, from the ground.

Approval of this waiver allows LATC the ability to integrate drone operations into the Professional Fixed-Wing Pilot, Unmanned Aerial Systems Pilot, and other drone technology-embedded programs. The skill sets and concepts developed with the BVLOS hands-on experience will be uniquely valuable for graduates and the drone industry. President Sanderson continued, "Students will learn mapping techniques, remote sensing methods, aerial imaging, and more for application in fields like construction, agriculture, public safety, and energy."

This BVLOS waiver presents opportunities for LATC students to be actively engaged with companies that develop drone equipment and software, and data collection along with internships and employment opportunities by immersing them in a highly advanced, real-world experience that has a direct influence on the FAA's goal of safe integration of UAS into the national airspace system.





ANOTHER EXTENSION AND PAYMENT RESUMPTION ON THE HORIZON

It's been an ongoing story. On October 14, 2022, the Department of Education launched a website allowing qualified borrowers to apply for student loan debt relief. Less than a month later, it was removed as a result of a November 14th federal appeals court decision to block President Biden's debt forgiveness plan.

On November 22nd, the Department of Education announced an extension of the payment pause. A second notice on studentaid. gov reads, "The student loan payment pause is extended until the U.S. Department of Education is permitted to implement the debt relief program or the litigation is resolved. Payments will restart 60 days later. If the debt relief program has not been implemented and the litigation has not been resolved by June 30, 2023 – payments will resume 60 days after that. We will notify borrowers before payments restart"

Over the recent Memorial Day weekend, President Biden and House Speaker Kevin McCarthy agreed to a proposal regarding the debt ceiling. This proposed bill text contains a provision that would codify President Biden's planned resumption of the student loan repayments by sunsetting the payment pause and interest accrual 60 days after June 30, 2023.

If you need to repay a federal student loan, be proactive! With June 30th just around the corner, you need to periodically check studentaid.gov for updates. Also, make sure that you are receiving communications from your federal loan servicer as they will also provide updates once a repayment date is established.

Marlene Seeklander, LATC Director of Financial Aid, stated, "We want to make sure that all of our student loan borrowers have an uneventful transition to repayment. If you don't know who your federal loan servicer is, please contact our office and we can assist you in finding that information."
