Cam Corey assumed duties as Lake Area Technical College's new Vice President on November 1, 2023.

He succeeds former Vice President Diane Stiles, who led the nationally recognized college since 2014.

"As Lake Area Tech's new vice president, I see each and every day the incredible commitment and dedication of our faculty and staff to student success," Corey said. "It is truly inspiring to be part of a college that prioritizes innovation, hands-on learning, and career readiness."

Corey recently retired from the law enforcement profession after serving for 25 years throughout the state of South Dakota. His storied career includes training law enforcement officers and agents; advocating for children, victims, and families; and leading the administrative operations of field service agencies. He has served on numerous state and national boards. He is a long-time educator in the law enforcement community, working as an adjunct instructor at Lake Area Technical College and several other colleges and universities, including the South Dakota Law Enforcement Training Center.

"Cam's professional track record speaks highly of his readiness to jump in and lead at Lake Area Tech," said President Tiffany Sanderson. "He is focused on student success, supporting our industry partners, and continuing to find innovative ways to advance our mission as the nation's premier technical college."

Corey is actively involved in community efforts such as REACH, a child advocacy center; Elite Alliance Volleyball Club; ArrowTV; and the Fraternal Order of Police, including Cops and Kids. He and his wife, Sarah, have four children and reside in Watertown. Cam has an Associate of Applied Science degree in Law Enforcement Technology and both a Bachelor and Master of Arts degree in Criminal Justice.

Corey says, "As a long-time resident of Watertown, I understand the shining star that Lake Area Tech is in our community, state, and the nation. Lake Area Tech has a celebrated history of workforce development and developing students to be difference makers in the communities they serve."

PROGRESS UPDATE

Excitement was in the air this fall with the completion and grand opening of the Ace A. Brandt Diesel Center (see ribbon cutting photos in this issue)! Steady work continues on the Archway project. Keep up with our monthly progress updates on our website at www.lakeareatech.edu.

ARCHWAY COMPLEX/DANA J. DYKHOUSE BUSINESS CENTER OF LEARNING/ADVANCED MANUFACTURING CENTER

The highly anticipated Archway Complex will tie the campus together via a walkway connecting the new Advanced Manufacturing building and the new Dana J. Dykhousé Business Center of Learning that will house the Business, Financial Services, and General Education programs. The two-story 29,000 square-foot Archway/Business Center and the three-story 16,800 square-foot Advanced Manufacturing Center are slated to open in Fall 2024.

LATEST UPDATES

- North Side: Industrial sheeting has been installed that will allow the building to be heated for winter interior work. Interior framework is mostly complete. Crews are working on HVAC/electrical installation and painting.
- South Side: Concrete work is complete and contractors have also installed industrial sheeting, allowing it to be heated for winter interior work. Site work and some masonry work will wait until spring. Crews are working on interior framework and HVAC/electrical installation.

LATC FOUNDATION DONATES NEW GAVEL TO SD HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

The Lake Area Technical College Foundation recently facilitated the creation of a new wooden gavel and sound block for the South Dakota House of Representatives. District 5 Representative and Speaker of the House, Hugh Bartels of Watertown, had conveyed last summer to Lake Area Tech President Tiffany Sanderson that the House gavel was in poor condition.

With the old, cracked gavel in hand, the LATC Foundation reached out to Riley Mohr, a 2014 LATC Building Trades Technology program graduate. When asked if he'd be interested in creating a new gavel and sound block for the House, Riley accepted the challenge.

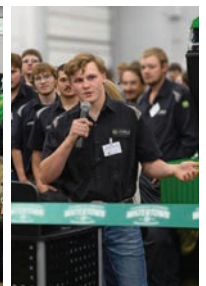
Riley, owner of the Woods Edge Shop in Watertown, built a new gavel head using the original as the pattern. He spared the handle, which only needed a little refurbishing. Once the head and handle were fashioned together, the finishing touch was affixing to the head the gavel's original gold band, engraved with "South Dakota House of Representatives." After completing the gavel, Riley crafted a new sound block to complete the set.

President Sanderson said, "We're honored that Speaker Bartels asked Lake Area Technical College to have a part in the on-going work of the House of Representatives. And we're pleased to showcase the quality craftsmanship of our graduates like Riley."

RIBBON CUTTING HELD FOR ACE A. BRANDT DIESEL CENTER

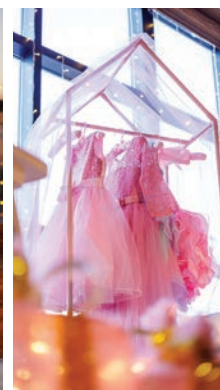

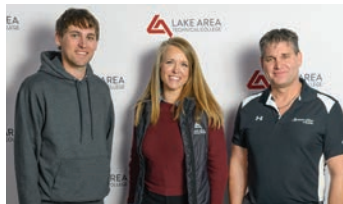
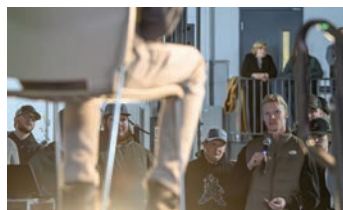

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TRANSFORMATIONAL UPGRADES ON DECK FOR DENTAL ASSISTING

A major remodeling project is scheduled to begin this spring in the Dental Assisting program area, giving the entire space a complete state-of-the-art renovation. The project will include:

- 10 fully functioning dental operatories for student use
- 14 state-of-the-art dental simulators that provide realistic training on mannequins for basic to advanced dental education
- Full dental lab facilities
- Dedicated patient waiting room
- Locker room for student use

Construction will start in March and continue through the summer with the goal of opening the new Dental Assisting facilities in Fall 2024. Gray Construction will complete the project.

LATC SELECTED FOR ADVANCED MANUFACTURING GRANT

Lake Area Technical College has received a \$342,504 Advanced Technological Education (ATE) grant from the National Science Foundation, the U.S. government's independent science agency.

The three-year grant will fund the college's Cultivating Career Pathways for Advanced Manufacturing Technicians, which will ultimately increase the number of trained professionals in South Dakota's advanced manufacturing workforce and increase the awareness of the industry among middle and high school students and teachers.

Lake Area Technical College President Tiffany Sanderson states, "South Dakota manufacturers supply high-tech products and components around the world, serving industries like energy, precision agriculture, and health care. The funding we received through the ATE grant gives Lake Area Tech the ability to build more awareness of manufacturing careers, train secondary teachers in today's manufacturing practices, and help grow the regions advanced manufacturing workforce for greater economic development."

Principal Investigator and Lake Area Technical College Robotic and Electronic Systems Technology Department Supervisor Brooks Jacobsen, will lead the new initiative along with Steven Trautner, LATC Precision Machining Department Supervisor. Businesses, community leaders, state agencies, and educators will play key roles in the grant's implementation. Partners include: South Dakota Manufacturing Technology Solutions, South Dakota Department of Labor and Regulation, South Dakota Department of Education, Build Dakota Scholarship Fund, Watertown Development Company, Aberdeen School District, Brookings School District, Northeast Technical High School, Agropur, Applied Engineering, Daktronics, Macksteel, Marmen Energy, 1905 Automation, Pivotal Health Solutions, and Valley Queen Cheese.

Jim Engels, CEO of Pivotal Health Solutions said, "Pivotal Health Solutions is thrilled to encourage students to discover the diverse and rewarding career paths available in the manufacturing industry in our region. We look forward to the positive impact this project will have on the lives of students and the broader community, fostering a deep appreciation for the dynamic and flourishing manufacturing sector in South Dakota."
