



REGISTERED NURSING

FALL 2025 ADMISSION INFORMATION

Applications will be accepted from September 1, 2024, until March 1, 2025, for the fall on-campus 2025 Associate of Applied Science Registered Nursing Program. Our program has full approval from the South Dakota Board of Nursing and has received full accreditation from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing. One class will be admitted in the fall each year. Individuals interested in the program need to have a current unencumbered LPN license. All students are required to have a laptop, which are available through Stax Bookstore or students may bring their own. See website for requirements.

Application Process

Admission applications are open September 1, 2024. Application packets are available online at: www.lakeareatech.edu.

All of the following materials **MUST** be turned in by the **priority deadline of March 1, 2025**.

- ✓ Completed application and fee
- ✓ Official high school and college transcripts
- ✓ If the applicant is a current Lake Area Tech student, verify transcripts are in place at LATC.

Transcripts must have an official school seal, copies will not be accepted. The grade report will be accepted if a final transcript is unavailable by the deadline date. A final official transcript is required when available to complete the transfer of courses. Interviews for selected applicants will be made available and acceptance is limited, with a waitlist. Accepted students must hold a valid and current CPR certification.

Acceptance Criteria

Admission is competitive. Acceptance into the program will be based on the following criteria:

- Most recent GPA of 2.75 or higher preferred
- Transferrable coursework must be completed with a grade of C or higher and science courses should not be more than seven years old (exceptions may be granted if the applicant is a practicing LPN)
- Completion of required courses
- An interview
- LPN program exit scores
- A letter of admission which includes the student's plan for success
- A letter of reference from a current healthcare employer or a former faculty
- Applicants will be notified of acceptance or denial by letter
- Acceptance is contingent on all the requirements being met

Students will also be required to provide a record of the following by the beginning of the school year:

- A physical examination within the last 24 months
- Current immunizations, including MMR, DPT, and polio
- Mantoux test (current within the last year) 2-step required; or quarterferon gold blood test
- Hepatitis titer (positive)
- Tdap (unless Td in last year)
- Varicella titer showing positive or proof of the series of two shots

The following immunizations are not requirements of LATC but are required by LATC clinical partners. Proof of these immunizations or religious or medical exemption from the immunization is required to complete the nursing clinical component:

- Influenza vaccination
- COVID vaccination

Criminal background checks are performed on all students before clinical rotations at the student's expense.

Early Acceptance

Early acceptance (a year in advance) is possible. Please review the following bullet points. This is not an automatic acceptance; applicants' files will be reviewed as they are submitted.

- The early acceptance status is granted based on the applicant's GPA and the need to complete generals (must have at least three general education courses to complete)
- The applicant may use the acceptance status a year before the RN program begins to complete those generals
- The applicant must successfully complete all attempted generals to keep acceptance status
- We will fill up to 12 early admitted students in each cohort

Courses marked with an asterisk (*) can be transferred directly to the university system.

Clock Hours: 15 Theory Clock Hours = 1 credit 30 Lab Clock Hours = 1 credit 45 Clinical Clock Hours = 1 credit

Clinical Hours: First Year Nursing (LPN) = 674 Second Year Nursing (RN) = 449

First Year Nursing (LPN): 44.5 Credits (12.5 credits in General Education and 32 credits in Technical Education or Nursing)

Second Year Nursing (RN): 41 Credits (18 credits in General Education and 23 credits in Nursing)

Total: 85 Credits (30.5 credits in General Education and 55.5 credits in Nursing)

If a student transfers from another LPN program, they must have a current nursing license. Upon proof of their license, 20 credits will be granted for the first year of nursing. An additional 18 credits in general education and 23 credits in nursing will be needed to meet graduation requirements for the RN degree.

If a student does not successfully complete one of the following courses: RN 206, RN 227, RN 230, RN 240, RN 236, RN 228 or RN 242, the student will be required to complete RN 245 – RN Skills Remediation before advancing in the Registered Nursing Program.
